

Cloverbud/Horseless Horse/Livestock Project Contract

1. You Must be a registered member of Hearts and Horseshoes 4-H. To register, go online to: <https://florida.4honline.com> If you were a member last year, your profile is still active. Log in and update your information. New members will need to set up a profile.
2. You must be 5 years old as of Sept. 1, 2011. Age groups are as follows: Junior 8-10 as of Sept. 1. Intermediate: 11-13 as of Sept. 1. Senior: 14-18 as of Sept. 1.
3. You must attend a minimum of 4 regular club business meetings. These meetings are usually held on the 1st Sunday of each month, but may occasionally differ due to show schedule conflicts. Check www.horseshoestables.com and click on the calendar link to stay apprised of important dates. Parents and family are encouraged to attend, but may not attend in place of a member and have the attendance count towards the contract.
4. Horseless Horse Project only: You must work with a Horse Project mentor twice per month to learn horse care and basic horsemanship. If your parents and safety permit, you may begin learning to ride with your mentor.
5. You must keep a record of hours spent working with your mentor, or your livestock project and note details of what was accomplished each day. Members may choose to write a minimum of 1 paragraph summary of their activities for each week and post it to the Hearts & Horseshoes web group @ <http://groups.yahoo.com/group/Heartsandhorseshoes4h/> or write a daily log for each month to be turned in at each meeting.
6. You must participate in 1 group fundraiser to benefit the whole club. Members who participate in hands-on fundraisers (like car washes) will have a percentage of the funds raised at that fundraiser available to them for use toward 4-H activities such as horse shows, livestock shows, camp, legislature, etc. Funds will be kept in the club account until a request is made (in writing) by the member. A percentage of each fundraiser will go

to benefit the whole club to pay for expenses such as club owned supplies, club tack room at 4-H shows, etc.

7. You must participate in a club sponsored community service project.
8. Your parents/guardians must work (chaperone) at least one fundraiser, county council meeting, or other 4-H trip.
9. You must abide by the 4-H code of conduct at all times, both at school and at 4-H events. Members who exhibit unsportsmanlike, or other inappropriate conduct may not be allowed to show or participate in other 4-H activities.
